## News from Rich Simpson, Vice President

As the summer of 2013 comes to a close, the Arnold Historical Society is preparing for the fall activities. During the **Arnold Days celebration, Sept. 20-22**, the Society will again have a **booth to sell the Historic Arnold book as well as Trivia Night tickets for Oct. 19**. We'll also share information about **Historic Richardson Cemetery** which Society members and Boy Scout Troop 744 maintain.

On **Sunday, Sept. 22**, the Historical Society will have a **float in the Arnold Days Parade** which begins at the Fox Service Center and marches to Arnold City Park.

The Society will hold its annual **Trivia Night on Oct. 19** at St. John's Lutheran School Gym, 3511 Jeffco Blvd. Doors open at 6:30 p.m. Trivia begins at 7 p.m. Member Scott Owen will be the caller. This is a fun night to share with friends and family. Trivia consists of 10 different questions in 10 different categories. The table with the highest score will receive a prize. Soda, water and popcorn are furnished. Guests may bring in other food. Attendance prizes will be available and 50-50 will be played. Tables of eight are \$15 per person or \$120 payable in advance; \$20 at the door.

The **Annual Meeting** of the Arnold Historical Society must be held on the first Sunday of November; this year being **November 3 beginning at 2 p.m. in the Lower Level of the museum at 1723 Jeffco Blvd**. This meeting is required by law since we are a non-profit organization. As part of the meeting, a Vice President and Treasurer will be elected. Following a short meeting, Eric Smith will present "The Prehistory of Jefferson County." Eric will bring local artifacts to share with members and visitors.


*Since November 3 is the first day of Central Daylight Time, be sure to set your clocks back one hour.*
